The Ambiance:	Located in downtown Los Angeles' historic Union Station, Traxx is outfitted with Art Deco fixtures, fine fabric and wood furniture, crisp linens and soft, evocative lighting. Unique features include a view of Thomas' open-line kitchen as well as concourse seating beneath a soaring 50-foot arch and a courtyard graced by a bubbling tile fountain accented with a canopy of Jacaranda trees.  The combination of the environment and the carefully prepared menu transports guests into the heart of a bygone era of romance and adventure. The kitchen, the modern sensibilities of the staff and the downtown location, meanwhile, have a decidedly "now" appeal.
The Bar:	The restaurant's stand-alone bar occupies the station's former telephone room. Its seductive

ambiance is perfect for a late night rendezvous. It is appointed with its original Art Deco "compass" chandelier, wood paneling and inlaid floor tile as well as modern amenities. Both Traxx's full menu and a menu of lighter fare are available at the bar.

Union Station History:

Dating from 1939, Union Station is a majestic structure that fuses Spanish Colonial, Art Deco, and Streamline Moderne Architecture. During the golden age of train travel, Union Station serviced the Southern Pacific, Union Pacific and Atchison Topeka & Santa Fe railways. Today, Union Station is regarded as both a national historic landmark, an anchor of downtown L.A.'s revitalization and one of the America's largest intermodal passenger terminals. A network of subways, buses, and light rail connects Union Station to virtually every part of Los Angeles and its surrounding cities. With a new high-speed rail line in the works, the station will be easily and rapidly connected to Central and Northern California.
